

## Responsive Scripture Reading



## Exodus 20:1-18

**The festival of Shavu'ot arrived, and the believers all gathered together in one place**

**Cong** Suddenly there came a sound from the sky like the roar of a violent wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting.

**Then they saw what looked like tongues of fire, which separated and came to rest on each one of them**

**Cong** They were all filled with the Ruach HaKodesh and began to talk in different languages, as the Spirit enabled them to speak.

**Now there were staying in Yerushalayim religious Jews from every nation under heaven.**

**Cong** When they heard this sound, a crowd gathered; they were confused, because each one heard the believers speaking in his own language.

**Totally amazed, they asked, "How is this possible? Aren't all these people who are speaking from the Galil?"**

**Cong** How is it that we hear them speaking in our own languages about the great things God has done?

**Amazed and confused, they all went on asking each other, "What can this mean?"**

**Cong** But others made fun of them and said, "They've just had too much wine!"

**Then Kefa stood up with the Eleven and raised his voice to address them: "You Judeans, and all of you staying here in Yerushalayim! Let me tell you what this means! Listen carefully to me!"**

**Cong** "These people aren't drunk, as you suppose — it's only nine in the morning.

Then God said all these words: "I am Adonai your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the abode of slavery.

"You are to have no other gods before me. You are not to make for yourselves a carved image or any kind of representation of anything in heaven above, on the earth beneath or in the water below the shoreline. You are not to bow down to them or serve them; for I, Adonai your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sins of the parents to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but displaying grace to the thousandth generation of those who love me and obey my mitzvot. "You are not to use lightly the name of Adonai your God, because Adonai will not leave unpunished someone who uses his name lightly.

"Remember the day, Shabbat, to set it apart for God. You have six days to labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Shabbat for Adonai your God. On it, you are not to do any kind of work — not you, your son or your daughter, not your male or female slave, not your livestock, and not the foreigner staying with you inside the gates to your property. For in six days, Adonai made heaven and earth, the sea and everything in them; but on the seventh day he rested. This is why Adonai blessed the day, Shabbat, and separated it for himself.

"Honor your father and mother, so that you may live long in the land which Adonai your God is giving you. "Do not murder. "Do not commit adultery. "Do not steal. "Do not give false evidence against your neighbor.

"Do not covet your neighbor's house; do not covet your neighbor's wife, his male or female slave, his ox, his donkey or anything that belongs to your neighbor" CJB
