Readings



Here is how the birth of Yeshua the Messiah took place. When his mother Miryam was engaged to Yosef, before they were married, she was found to be pregnant from the Ruach HaKodesh.

Cong Her husband-to-be, Yosef, was a man who did what was right; so he made plans to break the engagement quietly, rather than put her to public shame.

But while he was thinking about this, an angel of Adonai appeared to him in a dream and said, “Yosef, son of David, do not be afraid to take Miryam home with you as your wife

Cong for what has been conceived in her is from the Ruach HaKodesh.

She will give birth to a son, and you are to name him Yeshua, [which means ‘Adonai saves,] because he will save his people from their sins.”

Cong All this happened in order to fulfill what Adonai had said through the prophet,

“The virgin will conceive and bear a son, and they will call him ‘Immanu El.”

Cong (The name means, “God is with us.”)

When Yosef awoke he did what the angel of Adonai had told him to do — he took Miryam home to be his wife,

Cong but he did not have sexual relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Yeshua.

After Yeshua was born in Beit-Lechem in the land of Y’hudah during the time when Herod was king, Magi from the east came to Yerushalayim 2 and asked,

Cong “Where is the newborn King of the Jews? For we saw his star in the east and have come to worship him.”

(1) If I raise my eyes to the hills,
from where will my help come?

2 My help comes from Adonai,
the maker of heaven and earth.

3 He will not let your foot slip —
your guardian is not asleep.

4 No, the guardian of Isra’el
never slumbers or sleeps.

Adonai provides you with shade —

6 the sun can’t strike you during the day
or even the moon at night.

7 Adonai will guard you against all harm;
he will guard your life.
